

Dots & Spots

Difficulty: Easy

Who says colorwork has to be hard? Knit up some pizzazz for your golf clubs with this pattern, featuring bright colors, an easy slip stitch pattern and a funky square pompom!

SIZE

One size fits most golf clubs.

MATERIALS

- [MC] 1 skein Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); color: 44 Geranio
- [CC] 1 skein Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); color: 11 Apple Green
- US 5 / 3.75 mm straight needles
- US 7 / 4.50 mm straight needles
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Pompom maker (optional)

GAUGE

20 Sts/ 24 rows = 4 inches in St st on larger needles

PATTERN NOTES

Tiled Rib:

Row 1 (Right Side): P3, * k1, p1, k2, p3; rep from *.

Row 2: K3, * p2, k1, p1, k3; rep from *.

Row 3: P3, * k2, p1, k1, p3; rep from *.

Row 4: K3, *p1, k1, p2, k3; rep from *.

Tiny Tiles Pattern:

Row 1 (MC): Knit.

Row 2 (MC): Purl.

Row 3 (CC): k1, *sl 2 wyib, k2; rep from *, end k2.

Row 4 (CC): p2 *sl 2 wyif, p2; rep from *, end p1.

Row 5 and 6 (MC): Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 7 (CC): sl 1 wyib, *k2, sl 2 wyib; rep from *, end sl 2.

Row 8 (CC): sl 2 wyif; *p2, sl 2 wyif; rep from *, end sl 1.

Repeat these 8 rows for pattern.

PATTERN

Cast on 45 sts. Work in Tiled Rib for 6 inches. Change to larger needles. Work Tiny Tiles Pattern for 7 inches. Begin Decrease Rows as follows:



Decrease Rows:

Row 1: K2tog across to last 3 sts, end k3tog. (22 sts)

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K2tog across. (11 sts)

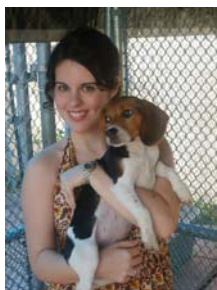
Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K2tog across to last 3 sts, end k3tog. (5 sts)

FINISHING

Cut yarn, leaving 18 inch tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tightly to close. Sew side seam. Make large pompom, trimming to square. Attach to top of cover. Weave in all ends.
