

Girly Swirly

Difficulty: Intermediate

SIZE

One size fits most golf clubs.

MATERIALS

- Malabrigo Worsted Weight Yarn (216 yards per 3.5 oz); 1 skein each color:
 1. [Lt Grn] 37 Lettuce
 2. [Med Grn] 11 Apple Green,
 3. [Dk Grn] 4 Sapphire Green,
 4. [Lt Pk] 184 Shocking Pink,
 5. [Med Pk] 39 Molly
 6. [Dk Pk] 44 Geranio
- 1 set US 5 / 3.75 mm double pointed needles
- 1 set US 7 / 4.5 mm double pointed needles
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Pompom maker

GAUGE

24 sts/ 32 rows = 4 inches in pattern on larger needles

PATTERN NOTES

The diagonal nature of the stitch pattern means that the beginning of each round will not remain in the same place; it will move diagonally with the pattern. Thus, there are two rounds in which you will finish by knitting stitches from the first needle of the previous round. You will also find it necessary to periodically rearrange the stitches on your needles in order to have an even number on each.

PATTERN

With smaller needles and Lt Grn, cast on 47 sts. Join to begin working in round.

Round 1: P1, *sl 1 wyib, p2; rep from *, end p1.

Round 2: *P1, Tw 2; rep from * around.

Round 3: *p2, sl 1 wyib; rep from * around; end p2 from Needle 1.

Round 4: * Tw 2; rep from *, end p1.

Round 5: * P1, sl 1 wyib; rep from *, end P1.



Round 6: P1, *Tw 2, p1; rep from * around; end p1 from Needle 1.

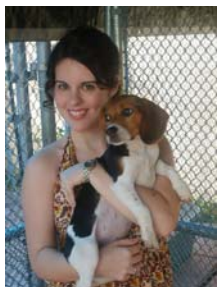
Work 6 inches in Lt Grn; change to larger needles and work 6 inches in Med Grn, then 1 inch in Dk Grn, ending on Row 2. Next round: *yo, p2 tog, sl 1 wyib; rep from * around, end yo, p2 tog from Needle 1.

Continue in pattern, beginning with Round 4. Work an additional 3 inches in Dk Grn. Bind off loosely.

FINISHING

Fashion a twisted cord out of Dk Pk by measuring a four-foot length of yarn and twisting at both ends until piece begins to twist upon itself. Grasping yarn at both ends, fold piece in half and allow yarn to shape itself into a cord. Thread through eyelet holes at top of cover. Make 2 small pompoms out of Lt Pk and Med Pk and attach to ends of twisted cord.
